

# Curriculum Overview | Guru Nanak Sikh Academy

## Year 3 | Spring 1| 2020-2021



<p><b>Literacy</b>  <b>Oliver and the Seawigs:</b> we will be reading this exciting adventure narrative which tells the story of Oliver who goes on a journey in search of his missing parents. Children will be writing a mystery narrative for their final objective.</p>	<p><b>Art</b>  <b>Egyptian Art:</b> our Art work will link to our History topic. In Art the children will learn how to make Egyptian jewellery and artefacts using a range of materials.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b>  <b>Number:</b> children will use the inverse to check answers to calculations. Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction.  <b>Measurement:</b> add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts.  <b>Statistics:</b> children will interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms.</p>	<p><b>Music</b>  Children will be taught by a specialist Music Teacher this half term. They will learn about folk music. They will learn the basics of UK folk and traditional music.</p>
<p><b>Humanities</b>  <b>Ancient Egypt:</b> children will begin this half term with a fun, absorbing and interactive Ancient Egyptian workshop. In class, children will learn about how significant the Egyptians were as a civilisation.</p>	<p><b>Punjabi and Sikh Studies</b>  <b>Home Life:</b> This term in Punjabi and Sikh studies the children will learn about home life. We will focus particularly on talking about the home routine.</p>
<p><b>Science</b>  <b>Animals and Humans:</b> children will look at different food groups and what makes a balanced diet. As well as this, they will look at the diet of different animals. The children will also learn about animal and human skeletons and how they support the body.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b>  <b>We Are Desktop Publishers:</b> Children will use desktop publishing software and consider careful choices of font size, colour and type to edit and improve documents. They will then be introduced to the terms 'templates', 'orientation', and 'placeholders' and begin to understand how these can support them in making their own template for a magazine front cover.</p>
<p><b>PSHE</b>  <b>Risks and Hazards:</b> children will be learning about safety in the local environment and unfamiliar places.</p>	<p><b>P.E</b>  <b>Personal:</b> children will learn to persevere with a task and improve their performance through regular practice.</p>

## Year 3 | Spring 2| 2020-2021

<p><b>Literacy</b> <b>Charlotte's Webb:</b> we will be reading this classic text which tells the story of a livestock pig named Wilbur and his friendship with a barn spider named Charlotte. Children will be writing a non-chronological report on a spider for their final objective.</p>	<p><b>Art &amp; DT</b> <b>Eating seasonally:</b> Children will learn about how climate affects food grown and learn about the fruits and vegetables grown in the UK. Children will also create their own healthy recipe.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b> <b>Fractions:</b> children will compare and order fractions. <b>Shape:</b> children will identify vertical, perpendicular and parallel lines. <b>Measure:</b> children will read and compare times in minutes and seconds.</p>	<p><b>Music</b> Children will be taught by a specialist Music Teacher this half term. They will continue to learn about the basics of UK folk and traditional music.</p>
<p><b>Humanities</b> <b>Climate and Weather:</b> Children will look at the world and think about the location of different climates and biomes. The children will have the opportunity to discuss extreme weather and its effects as well as understand and compare biomes thinking about how weather affects life there.</p>	<p><b>Punjabi and Sikh Studies</b> This term in Punjabi and Sikh studies the children will focus on listening, understanding and interpreting Panjabi stories. As well as this, they will be learning the names of fruit and vegetables in Punjabi.</p>
<p><b>Science</b> <b>Living Things and their Habitats:</b> Children will start by looking at what the word germination means and what plants need to grow before focusing on the specific parts of a plant, roots, stem, leaves and flower, and their roles. We will finish the term by looking more closely at how seeds are produced in a flower and then disperse.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b> <b>We Are Computer Networkers:</b> Children will develop their understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. They will also compare digital and non-digital devices.</p>
<p><b>PSHE</b> <b>Safe Relationships:</b> Children will learn about personal boundaries; safely responding to others and the impact of hurtful behaviour.</p>	<p><b>P.E</b> <b>Physical:</b> Children will learn to perform a variety of body movements and skills using body tension.</p>
